CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

(All entry fees, admission charges and prize money is GST inclusive.)

1. Close of Entries

Entries Close on **Monday 7th December 2009 at 4.30pm**. Postal to: Barastoc, Equestrian Victoria, PO Box 616, Werribee, VIC 3030, or online www.vic.equestrian.org.au or www.nominate.com.au

Late entries will be accepted up to 5.00pm Monday 4th January 2010; however a 50% surcharge will apply to entry fees only.

2. The Organising Committee reserves the right to accept or reject any entry or vary the conditions of any event or to cancel any event without assigning a reason.

3. Facility Fee

Exhibitors will be required to pay a compulsory **Facility Fee of \$11.00 per horse/pony entered, per day**. This fee will be passed onto the Werribee Park National Equestrian Centre.

4. Security Fee

In order to protect the venue, sponsor signs and exhibitors equipment, the Committee has decided to set a fee to cover the cost of overnight security during the 2010 Show.

Exhibitors will be required to pay a compulsory Security Fee of \$5.00 per horse/pony entered.

5. Registration of Horses

Life Horse Registration is \$129 or Equestrian Victoria now allows a **Probationary Registration** for new horses (cost \$80x 2 instalments).

This allows the horse to be part registered (\$80 is payable with original application). If the horse is to continue being shown, the "second half fee of \$80" is payable in the following year, at which time the horse is considered, registered for Life.

6. Insurance – Applies to all sections & classes

Competitors (Riders & Handlers) who are not financial members of Equestrian Victoria must include an additional \$25.00, for **Public Liability Insurance**, and include a signed Waiver (attached to entry form)

The Equestrian Australia membership number must be shown on the entry form, in the space provided.

(Note – Must be Junior, Senior or Show Horse Membership. Official/Supporter Level of membership not accepted.)

****See special Membership Offer which provides Equestrian Victoria membership to the 30th June 2010 for a fee of \$50. This fee includes Insurance which covers the person for Barastoc and at all times when riding their horse during the membership period**

7. Exhibit Numbers

Exhibit Numbers will be supplied by the Organising Committee. Exhibitors will be required to collect their Exhibit Numbers from the Secretary's Office on arrival.

Exhibitors will be issued with their paid copy of the Program, when collecting Exhibit Numbers

8. Exhibitor Passes

Exhibitors will not be issued with Complimentary Passes. However, exhibitors may purchase an Exhibitors Pass (\$25) with their entries. An Exhibitors Pass will admit an exhibitor's horse transporting vehicle and its occupants. Only exhibitors able to produce an Exhibitors Pass will be allowed entry to the venue, at no charge. Where an Exhibitors Pass cannot be produced the following admission charges will apply -

An Exhibitor Pass cannot be obtained at the gate and occupants of support vehicle will be required to pay admission charges.

9. Drug Testing and Swabbing

The Committee reserves the right to take blood and/or urine samples from all or any horse/s present at Werribee Park in accordance with the EA Rules and/or the relevant regulations contained in the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria's Prize Schedule for Horse Events.

10. Measuring

All exhibitors must be able to produce a height certificates upon request. The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria's 2009 Royal Show and 2010 Summer Show Measurements and/or Equestrian Australia Official Measurements will be accepted upon production of the relevant documents, provided the horse was 6 years old or over at the time of Measurement, excluding all Newcomers – Section Sixteen (16). **All Newcomer FINALISTS must be measured prior to entering the ring. If a Newcomer FINALIST measurers over or under the required height, the exhibit will not be permitted to transfer to the correct height class, and will therefore be eliminated from any further competition in the Newcomers Section.**

Horses and Ponies not measured prior to the Event must be presented for measuring on the day of competition at a time to be advised. In the event of a height variation, an exhibit will be transferred to the correct category.

All exhibitors may be requested to produce Original Height Certificates on the day. Exhibitors not able to do so will have their horses measured.

11. Heats

Horses entered in classes, which are conducted in heats, must compete in the heat drawn. Failure to present for the heat drawn will result in automatic elimination. Exhibitors with two or more horses entered in a class must indicate on the entry form if they wish the horses to be drawn in different heats.

12. Finalists (All Saddle Classes)

Once a finalist for a class has been selected, there will be no substitution should a horse/s not present for final judging.

13. Objections (All except showjumping)

Any objections or protests must be made in writing and signed, and handed to the secretary with a deposit of AUS\$100 prior to the commencement of judging for the class concerned or within thirty (30) minutes after presentation of sashes/ribbons. The Committee or their appointed representative/s shall determine the objection and will call such evidence as they think fit. If the decision goes against the objector, he/she will forfeit his/her deposit of AUS\$100 and be liable for any expenses occasioned by the objection. Should the objection be allowed by the Committee, the deposit will be refunded.

Should the objector wish to appeal the Committee's decision, he/she must lodge an appeal in accordance with the rules of Equestrian Australia.

14. Handler's Attire

Horses may be held in Ring centre during preliminary judging, however handlers must be correctly dressed. Handlers wearing shorts and thongs, or tracksuits will not be permitted into the ring.

15. Eligibility for Championship Awards

In Sections where a Panel of Judges carries out the judging of the "Championship Award", the onus is on the owner/exhibitor to ensure the horse and themselves are eligible to compete under any of the Judges concerned.

No Judge will stand aside for the judging of a "Championship Award".

16. Age of Horses

The minimum age of a horse competing in the Saddle Sections is three (3) years of age.

Age of Riders

The age of a Rider will be as per the first day (17/2/2010) of the Show, unless stated otherwise.

17. Whips

The maximum length for whips is 78 cm, including flaps.

18. Costume

When riding ponies 14 hands & under riders must wear jodhpurs and short boots.

19. Helmets

Approved Equestrian Helmets must be worn at all times when riding at the Werribee Park National Equestrian Centre.

Show Hunters are not expected to jump.

- The turnout for Show Hunters is more subdued than that of Show Pony and Hack classes. There should be no coloured browbands on horses or ponies, or multi coloured hair ribbons and flowers on child riders. Junior riders in classes 36 and 37 should not wear top boots.
- All horses must be registered with EA.
- All riders (12 years of age and over) and owners must be current financial members of EA at the time of entry and on the day of the show.
- Stallions not eligible.
- Competitors in this Section are not eligible for Section 20. (Open Saddle Classes) or section 5 (Junior Saddle Horses).

- No penalty is incurred if the lower pole on the same vertical plane is lowered. If a pony / horse jumps the incorrect fence it will be eliminated. Ponies / horses displaying continued disobedience or leaving the ring, whether the rider is mounted or dismounted will be eliminated. Jumping Phase will be taken first, any pony / horse eliminated or disqualified will not be required again.
- All riders must wear approved safety helmets.
- All horses (classes 52 & 53) must be registered with EA.
- All horses (classes 54 & 55) must be registered with EA, the Australia Pony Stud Book Society or the Welsh Pony and Cob Society of Australia.
- All riders (12 years of age and over) and owners must be current financial members of EA at the time of entry and on the day of the show.

Entry Fee: \$25.00 per entry (No refund after entries close)

Conditions of Entry

- Open to ponies 12.2 hands and under, ridden by children 12 years and under.
- Ponies in the First Ridden Saddle Pony Championship will trot on the circle together and will only canter during individual workouts.
- To be ridden in snaffle bridle and judged on conformation, manners and paces and suitability as a small child's mount.
- Spurs not permitted.
- Ponies and/or Riders may be entered in the First Ridden Saddle Pony Championship and the Leading Rein Pony Championship, but may only compete in one Section.
- Please note: Both classes will be judged at the same time in separate rings.
- All Ponies in the First Ridden Class must be registered with EA.
- Riders must be 12 years and under on the day of the Show. Riders must be able to produce Birth Certificates upon request.
- Riders need not be Members of EA.
- All owners must be current financial members of EA at the time of entry and on the day of the show.
- Performance qualifications are not required.
- Stallions not eligible.
- Ponies may be entered in both classes 56 & 57. However, a pony that wins the first class judged may not compete in the other class at 2010 Show. No refund of entries fees.

FIRST RIDDEN PONY RIDERS – As First Ridden Ponies are supposed to be the sort of pony that will take a young rider safely on their first solo outing, it has been decided that they MUST be ridden by this sort of rider. Therefore, at the 2010 Barastoc Show, riders of First Ridden Ponies may NOT have won a Rider Championship at a Royal Show, a Horse Of The Year Show, or Grand National Horse Of The Year Show. We feel this is in keeping with the spirit of the event

Prizes

- **Winner:** The winners will receive an embroidered horse rug, garland and an inscribed sash. The winning rider will receive an inscribed sash.
- **Sashes:** Sashes will be awarded to 6th place.
- **Special Prize:** A special prize will be awarded to all riders in this class.
